Program participants are invited to spend a day in a longitudinal educational experience where patients stories shared will serve as the foundation upon which the theoretical principles of palliative care, the practical application of palliative care and various settings of palliative care will be reviewed. The conference will close with a workshop where participants in small group sessions will present a patient case and apply the principles learned.

OBJECTIVES

1. Demonstrate an understanding of the principles of palliative care.
2. Understand the scope of practice and services provided by palliative care.
3. Identify patients who would benefit from palliative care.
4. Conceptualize the use of palliative care within their care setting.
5. Gain insight into the functioning of the interdisciplinary palliative care team.

Cory Ingram, M.D., is a Family Physician-Geriatrician at Immanuel St. Joseph's – Mayo Health System in Mankato, MN. He is currently a fellow in Palliative Medicine at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center in Lebanon, New Hampshire. He has spoken nationally and internationally on primary care of dementia patients. Dr. Ingram has also trained in Hospice Medicine at St. Christopher's Hospice in London. Upon completion of his fellowship in Palliative Care, Dr. Ingram will return to Immanuel St. Joseph's – Mayo Health System to chair a new Department of Palliative Care, serve as the regional director of the Mayo Clinic Practice Based Research Network, and continue to teach at the University of Minnesota.

Lisa A. Stephens, MSN, APRN, ACHPN is an Adult Nurse Practitioner and Certified Advance Practice Hospice and Palliative Nurse with 19 years experience in hospice and palliative nursing. In 1999, Lisa received the National Certified Hospice and Palliative Nurse of the Year Award presented to her by the National Hospice and Palliative Nurses Association. Lisa currently works as a nurse practitioner on the Palliative Care Service, directed by Dr. Ira Byock, at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center, Lebanon, NH. She is an instructor in the Dept. of Anesthesiology, providing palliative care learning experiences for Dartmouth Medical School students and residents at DHMC.
