Federal Financial Aid

Graduate students may apply for Federal Direct Loans, Federal Direct Graduate PLUS Loans, and private educational loans. Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The FAFSA becomes available October 1 for the next academic year. Graduate Assistantships

- Full-time (20 hrs./per week): Up to a \$10,000 stipend and 9 credits of tuition paid per semester.
- Part-time (10 hrs./per week): Up to a \$5,000 stipend and 4.5 credits of tuition paid per semester.

MSW Program Opportunities

Currently, the MSW Program has two stipend programs to supplement coursework and help offset the cost of graduate education and another under development.

- Title IV-E Child Welfare Scholar Stipend: \$15K per year (Generalist and Specialist), plus professional development money. Recipients are required to complete each practicum experience in a tribal, public or other approved child welfare setting. Students apply AFTER accepting admission to the MSW program. - 2. Behavioral Health Initiative (HRSA, Health Resources and Services Administration) Stipend: Available in the Specialist year (2nd year) focused on Integrated Behavioral Health. \$10K stipend the semester of practicum, plus professional development money. Recipients are required to complete the Specialist year practicum in a setting that provides integrated behavioral health. Students apply AFTER accepting admission to the MSW program. - 3. **Center for Rural Behavioral Health Fellowship**. The Fellowship is currently under development and will be affiliated with the new University Outpatient Mental Health Clinic. Students will receive a stipend and tuition support for 2 years in exchange for completing practicum placement at the clinic. More details to come. Anticipated launch for this program is August 2024.
