Dental Hygiene Program Prerequisites

Dental Hygiene has pre-requisite courses in three distinct areas, with some courses that must be completed before the application, and others before beginning the program

General Education Prerequisites

Five of these courses (including DHYG 100) must be completed prior to applying, and the remainder before beginning the program.

- ENG 101 (4)– Composition
 - CMST 100 (3) – Fundamentals of Communication
 - or CMST 102 (3) – Public Speaking
 - PSYC 101 (4) – Psychology
 - SOC 101 (3) – Introduction to Sociology
 - or SOC 150 (3) – Social Problems
 - STAT 154 (4) – Elementary Statistics
 - or SOC 202 (3) – Introductory Social Statistics
 - FCS 242 (3) – Nutrition for Healthcare Professionals
 - or FCS 140 (3) – Introduction to Nutrition
 - DHYG 100 (1) – Perspectives in Dental Hygiene
- *5 courses must be completed before *applying* – one of which must be DHYG 100 (the other must be done before starting the program)

Science Prerequisites

Three of these courses must be completed before applying, and the other before beginning the program.

- BIOL 220 (4) – Human Anatomy
 - BIOL 270 (4) – Microbiology
 - CHEM 106 (3) – Chemistry of Life Process I
 - Or CHEM 111 (5) - Chemistry of Life Process II
 - BIOL 330/310 (4) – Principles/Basics of Human Physiology
- *3 courses must be completed before *applying* (the other must be done before starting the program)

Dental Hygiene Prerequisites

One of these courses must be completed before applying, and the other two before beginning the program.

- DHYG 219 (2) – Head and Neck Anatomy
 - DHYG 223 (3) – Pharmacology
 - DHYG 225 (2) – Oral Anatomy
- *1 course must be completed before *applying* (the others must be done before starting the program)
