All MNSU students are encouraged to create a Strategic Academic Plan that includes planning for their current major and a parallel plan for an alternate major/program. Parallel plans are vital in the event a student's interest and career plans change, or a student is unable to gain admission to a particular major. Creating a parallel plan is about preparing for <u>all</u> the possibilities! Having a parallel plan will allow you to pivot with ease to your alternate major/program and complete a meaningful degree in a reasonable timeframe. Work through the next 5 steps to develop your Strategic Academic Plan.

Step 1: Self-Awareness

Reflect on the following questions:

- What interests me in pursuing my current major?
- What courses do I most enjoy?
- What courses am I most successful in?
- What courses do I dislike or have struggled in?
- What values are important in my life?
- What activities do I enjoy? When am I at my best?
- What types of problems do I enjoy solving?
- What are my top skills that I feel most confident in?
