## Applying to MSU:

To complete the Post-baccalaureate certificate in Communication Sciences and Disorders, apply to MSU using the <u>online application for undergraduate students</u>. Below are some tips while completing the online application:

After completing sections about your personal information, citizenship, and contact information, you will complete a section on your education history. Although it is not a required field, be sure to select your **Degree Earned** (or will be earned) under 'Education-College/University Attended.'

In a later section requesting information regarding your intended major, you will be asked to indicate your educational intent. Select "Earn occupational certificate/ diploma."

Next, click the green Add Major/Program button.

Under "preferred delivery method," choose "**on Campus**" - even if you plan to take some or all of your courses online. Next, select **Communication Disorders** under desired major/academic program. Finally, select **Bachelor of Science** under desired degree/award.
