UNK clinic aids speech with therapy

KEARNEY - Twelve-year-old Derek Bailey never ordered what he really wanted to eat at a restaurant - he'd order whatever was easy to say. And 21-year-old Eric Swartz stayed away from the telephone as much as possible.

Stuttering was the roadblock that stood in their way. But through a technique of monitoring their own speech, the lines of communication are opening for them.

THE TECHNIQUE involves controlling the rate of speech with the help of a delayed auditory feedback machine, plus continuous phonation - similar to saying one long word.

Both receive speech therapy at the Speech and Hearing Clinic at the University of Nebraska at


Derek Bailey of Berwyn, son of Tom and Irone Bailey, said his stuttering problem surfaced when he was in third grade.




